Consultation on revised/additional documents for planning applications relating to Mount Pleasant Sorting Office, Clerkenwell, in the London Boroughs of Camden and Islington

You have previously been consulted on the following development in your neighbourhood:

Comprehensive redevelopment of two sites (Phoenix Place and Calthorpe Street) to construct a series of buildings up to 3 to 15 storeys to provide 681 residential units (76,739 sq.m. GIA), offices (4,260 sq.m. GIA), flexible retail/community space (2,251 sq.m. GIA of use class A1, A2, A3, D1 or D2), with associated energy centre, waste and storage areas, vehicle parking (119 spaces),cycle parking, landscaping, public and private open spaces. Other works include alterations to the public highways and associated works, including demolition, excavation and enabling works, with a new dedicated vehicle ramp to basement to service Royal Mail operations, an acoustic roof over the service yard (enclosing 14,150 sq.m. at basement and ground floor), and re-provision of Royal mail staff parking (196 spaces) in the basement of Phoenix Place site. (Conservation area consent is also sought for demolition works in the Calthorpe Street site)

At: Land to west and north west of Mount Pleasant Sorting Office, bounded by Farringdon Road, Calthorpe Street, Phoenix Place, Gough Street and Mount Pleasant, Clerkenwell, London EC1A 1BB.

On 21 January 2014 the Mayor of London issued a direction to Camden Council and Islington Council setting out that he would act as the local planning authority for the purposes of determining these applications (under article 7 of the Mayor of London Order (2008) and the powers conferred by Section 2A of the 1990 Town and Country Planning Act (as amended)).
