The walls running E to W seem to be of consistent height, except for one higher wall which forms the northern boundary of Eton College Estate. It is true that the walls running N to S separating the gardens from Buckland do seem to vary in height.</p> <p>Para 4.2 The pergola is NOT a wooden structure. It has brick footings, steel upright pillars (with wooden cladding) and a (possibly) wooden frame supporting ugly translucent plastic panels. The picture, taken from near ground level, is distorted by fore-shortening, which disguises the enormity of the structure when seen from above.</p> <p>Para 4.3 There may eventually be climbing plants, but also piles of dead leaves which are already accumulating on the flat roof.</p> <p>Para 4.4 Tidying up the garden has no bearing on the construction.</p> <p>Para 4.5 There are no other structures of similar type. There are one or two small wooden sheds nearby and one summer house with an elegant pointed roof.</p> <p>Friends who have visited have commented on the ugliness of the structure.</p> <p>I strongly object to this structure.</p>

Whilst my daughter has no objection in principle to a pergola being erected in the garden of the building, she believes that the existing structure is unsightly and not in keeping with either the surrounding properties or the conservation area in general. The structure, which was erected without planning permission, is over-sized for the space available and is constructed of materials more in keeping with a modern car-port than a conservation area. The flat roof collects fallen leaves during autumn and winter providing a particularly unsightly view from any over-looking windows. My daughter would support the erection of an alternative structure which would be both smaller and designed and constructed of materials more sympathetic to the surrounding area.</p>
