Hi Richard,

Please find attached the amended drawings as per your comments on our NMA application for Leighton Road.

All of the windows have been increased in height by 150mm, the rear windows have been enlarged where requested, and the cladding has been changed so that the top floor recessed area is a different material and format to the projecting bay. Attached is a photo of our samples of the VM Zinc brown zinc and slate coloured Anthrazinc which we will submit with the conditions information.

The extent of the maisonette building has also been amended to suit the new boundary conditions as I mentioned on the telephone a couple of weeks ago.

We were not able to reduce the parapet height which is as high as possible while maintaining a 150mm upstand. However, the windows here have been made higher, and we have shown a fascia panel to the top which breaks down the are above the windows.

The back of the bike store has also been opened up to allow direct to all bike racks.

Please let me know if you would like to discuss any of this, and when we might be able to get approval - and can submit remaining / additional conditions information.

Happy New Year, I hope you're well.

We have been preparing drawings to submit as part of an non-material amendment application for 59-61 Leighton Road, and have included the following as discussed at our meeting on 18.12.13:

- Increasing the width of all of the juliet balconies and double doors
- Including for full height windows to the side elevation where we had shown these as smaller windows
- Reducing the proposed parapet height to be within 100mm of the consented scheme
- Infilling the area adjacent to the residential entrance to provide an internal cycle store
- Chamfering the corner to the rear of the main block

In making these changes, the setting out of the cladding to the projecting bay / top floor has also been adjusted to have a more horizontal emphasis, and the drawings now note this as being brown zinc. I wanted to confirm that this change should form part of the application and we will include some images of this as well. Otherwise I could just remove the note and this could be dealt with by discharge of conditions, although this might be confusing not having a note about the material.

Please let me know what you prefer and we will send this in later this week.
