Reason(s) for Refusal

1 The proposed development would result in the loss of a family sized dwelling and fail to contribute to the creation of mixed and inclusive communities by providing a range of replacement dwelling sizes, including high priority 2 bedroom accommodation, contrary to policies CS6 (Providing quality homes) and DP5 (Homes of different



sizes) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy and Development Policies

2 The proposed development, in the absence of a legal agreement for car-free housing, would be likely to contribute unacceptably to parking stress and congestion in the surrounding area, contrary to policies CS11 (Promoting sustainable and efficient travel), CS19 (Delivering and monitoring the Core Strategy), DP18 (Parking standards and limiting the availability of car parking) and DP19 (Managing the impact of parking) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy and Development Policies.
