



Dear Cllr Rea

I am writing to you and the planning dept e-mail which is on the notice outside 14 minster Road.

Putting the Eruv pole in the location that has been suggested causes a couple of issues.

Minster Road is very busy and there is no proper crossing except at corners. For wheelchairs and pushchairs to cross they will be using the busiest part of the road.

We have a lime tree that needs pruning every couple of years. The pictures with the proposed pole was taken just after the trees were pruned. The 8 residents of 14 Minster Road are concerned about the restrictions we will have in cutting back those trees.

We have several birds nesting in those trees and therefore we do not like mesh going across Minster Road.

It would make more sense to move the Eruv poles to the bridge. We have seen numerous Eruv poles that are not on the pavement by residences.

We know that Eruv poles are now part of many areas in London. We strongly object to the position in the planning application. Moving them to the bridge further down the road is a more suitable location.
