I am writing to express my objection to the redevelopment of 21 Belsize Crescent, planning application 2014/2947/P

I grew up and am currently living in 19A Belsize Crescent and therefore have very strong feelings towards the existing structure between numbers 19 and 21 Belsize Crescent and the proposed redevelopment plans.

The existing structure currently cuts out light to our main stairwell and rooms below. A window on the same side at the back of the house provides light to what would otherwise be a very poorly lit area.

I was shocked to discover plans have been re-submitted to develop the current illegal structure. The existing structure should never have been built for two reasons. The first is the negative impact on the quality of life for the family in the basement and secondly in terms of conservation it falls short of confining to Belsize Conservation Area standards.

I cannot fathom the short sightedness of such a proposal and its repeated reappearance when taking into account the enormous negative impacts it will have on the living standards of me and my family and the Belsize Conservation Area.

To summarize, I for one am strongly against the proposal to redevelop the illegal structure between 19 and 21 Belsize Crescent and do not want our living standards in 19A nor the heritage of Belsize Crescent to be diminished.
