I watched on BBC London New the story regarding Athlone House and the proposal that it should be knock down. I am not a resident of Camden nor a regular visitor to the Heath however I am concerned about the flouting of the planning rules. When the original planning proposal was accepted the restoration of the existing building must have been considered a viable proposition.
