Proposal: Erection of a rear dormer and roof terrace with privacy screen and balustrade and associated alterations to rear parapet (part retrospective).

The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** planning permission for the following reason(s):

Reason(s) for Refusal

The dormer roof extension, roof terrace and privacy screen, by reason of their prominent location, bulk, massing and detailed design, would be harmful to the appearance of the host building and the character and appearance of the terrace and wider area, and would have a detrimental impact on the amenity of no. 69 Sumatra Road in terms of loss of outlook and sense of enclosure, contrary to policy CS14 (Promoting High Quality Places and Conserving Our Heritage) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy, policy DP24 (Securing High Quality Design), policy DP26 (Managing the impact of development on occupiers and neighbours) of the London Borough of Camden Local



Development Framework Development Policies.
