As a local resident and constatnt user of Swains Lane & its shops, I write to object to the current PA 2013/6647/P.

Nos 1-11 Swains Lane & 109-110 Highgate West Hill.

- Camden Core Strategy Policy CS4 reuires that a development should 'respect the character
 of its surroundings'. This proposal does so neither in its design nor in its materials.
- It is too massive: height should be restricted, on West block at least, to two storeys. If project
 not viable without third storey, that should be kept well back, and total height restricted to
 protect residents in Church Walk.
- Uniform white render is contrary to grain of local built structure. Red brick is the dominant elemnt locally, though a few stuccood (not necessarily white) buildings survive. The 19thcentury villas on west side of Highgate West Hill are irrelevant, heavily obscured by foliage and anyway not visible from main aspects.
- Design altogether too metropolitan, and hostile to Arts & Crafts style block of flats & shops adjoining to west, characterised by hipped pitched tiled roof with dormers effectively reducing seen height.
- Junction of three-storey element with two-storey curved west end very clumsy & of poor design.
- Replacement of buildings in Conservation Area should enhance the CA. This design is thoroughly mediocre and does nothing to enhance the CA.
- Retail units are too many & too small.
- Parking. Why are five parking spaces provided when Camden purues a 'car-free' policy?
 Moreover, there is insufficient space for a turning circle, so that cars would have to reverse
 onto busy, bus-route, West Hill. Such space as available should be for traders' deliveries, as
 otherwise intolerable burden on residents' parking in Swains Lane once a lively shopping
 parade restored.
- Basement provision for plant demands a Basement Assessment, particularly as there are hidden petrol tanks left from former car service station on site.
- Construction assessment Plan essential to enable residents to evaluate development conditions
- Consultation with local community claimed by developer terminated by him prior production
 of application design which is quite different from what he was mooting and publicising in the
 summer.

The current prposals must therefore be withdrawn and thoroughly re-workd to achieve a design acceptable to the local community as well as to the owner.
