Erection of single storey rear extension at ground level to residential flat. The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** planning permission for the following reason(s):

Reason(s) for Refusal

1 The proposed extension by reason of its depth, bulk and position on the rear elevation would be an incongruous and obtrusive addition to the building which would detract from the appearance and special architectural and historic interest of this terrace of Grade II listed buildings and the wider Camden Town Conservation Area. The proposed extension would further alter the historic floor plan which is characteristic of these Listed buildings contrary to policy CS14 (Promoting high quality places and conserving our heritage) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy and policies DP24 (Securing high quality



design) and DP25 (Conserving Camden's Heritage) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies.
