I am writing to voice my strong objection to the proposed change in building code/usage of the above referenced area.

Triyoga is unique in that it not only offers yoga, pilates and therapy but - most importantly - it is a community hub. Triyoga's large entrance area is a place where people can meet before or after classes, where friendships are forged and strengthened, where a community is built. There are no other yoga centres which offer such an extensive part of their space just for people to meet and hang out. All other studios are very conscious to make the most profit from their space and thus would fit in another studio instead.

I have been going to triyoga's wonderful yoga classes since its opening. I cannot even comprehend what this proposed change would mean for the local community of businesses and the yoga/pilates community in particular.

I find it appalling that an existing conservation area is threatened by financial speculators who - most likely - will have no connection to the local residential and business community in Primrose Hill. Instead they are after turning a profit.

I am urging the council to value sustainable development and maintenance of an established area and community - unique in London. Primrose Hill is a nicely mixed area of high value as well as council housing - this mix is rare.

I hope you will support the residents and local community - not investors and profiteers.
