

As a active member of the triyoga community (student and teacher), I have recently learned about the Camden Council's plans regarding the premises of triyoga.

I would like you to know that Triyoga is an integral part of the Primrose Hill community and has been an active contributor to and service provider for the area over the last 13 years. This institution has created a welcoming, accepting atmosphere and sense of community for which many people from the area and beyond enjoy and are happy to pay a fee for service in keeping this part of the community running. As you know, London residents, tourists, and many others come to Primrose Hill because it offers a sense of peace and beauty - this includes its shops, yoga studios and restaurants.

The triyoga site is within the Primrose Hill Conservation Area and the change of use and the proposed physical alterations are out of keeping with the character and appearance of the Conservation Area. Leeder House and the other units are still suitable for continued business use and should continue to be protected as such as indicated by policy DP13.

I hope this Council will seriously consider adopting a <u>comprehensive approach to the development of</u> <u>all and buildings at 6 Erskine Road, including trivoga</u>, so that the trade-offs and impacts can be fully understood and assessed.
