Thank you for bringing this planning application to our attention.

We live at number [REDACTED] which is on the South East side of the school building. We are not directly affected by the proposed buildings but we are by the proposed cladding of the side of the school facing us.

The school building is ugly and imposing for those of us who live opposite. The coloured aluminium plates that are proposed to replace the dull yellow tiles will be an increased eyesore. We are vehemently opposed to the mixture of bold green and yellow colours which are intended to incorporate the school colours.

We accept that the windows and tiles need replacing due to their insulating inefficiency but we insist that the choice of colours or colour should be neutral and not draw attention to this ghastly structure. Perhaps a terracotta colour would serve the purpose better.

Some 29 years ago we lived at [REDACTED] and always enjoyed the unfettered view to the south past the end of the school building.

We feel very concerned for the present owners with the planned erection of the two story building which will block their view.

We do not think that enough consideration has been given to neighbours of the school of the encroachment of the open space between our properties and the school building. Nor has sufficient consideration been given to the adverse visual effect the choice of

colours to the façade will have.
