I understand that there is still time for comments to be lodged on the above application, which I would like to do as a regular visitor to the Heath and the women's pond. I am particularly concerned by the implications of the proposed charges for Millfield Lare and the lades'

pond. This is a lovely stretch of lane which would be very much disturbed by such heavy traffic as planned. The lane is also currently used by both pedestrians and cyclists, which can accommodate each other easily. I am not sure how we will be able to use the lane in addition to lorines and other construction vehicles, in a sometimes marcow lane with no pavement. I would be very much against any changes to the lane to make it suitable for this land of traffic, as the way that it is most like a country lane without tarmaci is what makes it so special. It is unfortunate for the owners of the development but surely the charm of the area is what much have attracted them in the first place.
