I saw the Aspen at no 22 Laurier Rd this afternoon.

It is a beautiful, slender, young specimen and I feel strongly that it should not be removed. It is not near to a garden wall, just a wooden fence, so no damage to boundary. I went through the basement (No 22a) of the tenant of this Circle 33 flat. (He is not well).

I talked to a friend in the street and she said that Circle 33 tend to neglect their trees, let them grow too big and then ask to remove them. This tree does overhang No 24's rear garden, but it is not a dense structure, and therefore does not take too much light.

I suggest a light prune and a possible TPO to save it. I do hope that it can be saved, it is a rarely planted species, and beautiful.
