Dear Jenna,

We are writing on behalf of the Camden Town CAAC - and I'm sorry this reply is late in getting to you.

No 33 is an odd house, originally probably part of a terrace but now standing alone. It must date from the early years of the 19th century but has been badly altered recently and before that. So as not to add to the many alterations so far, we object to the proposed roof terrace which will be seen from the side in Inverness Street and from all the buildings at the rear. The roof terrace would stand out in an inappropriate manner above the high cornice and destroy the lines of the existing roof. Also, internally, there will be loss of original roof joinery.

We do not object to the proposed new window on the rear elevation although we do strongly object to the proposed canopy for the front door. This kind of canopy belongs to a building of the late 17th century (for example, the houses in Great Ormond Street) and not to the houses in Inverness Street.

Generally, there have been far too many alterations and additions to this house.
