Dear Elaine,

We object to this application.

This early 19th century house already has a long back extension on one side of the house. (It is the longest extension in this part of the street). The proposal seeks to double-up the extension on the ground floor, creating another long brick wall which will be hard on the adjoining neighbour to the north.

The application also proposes to install glass doors over the full width of the house on the ground floor as well as glass doors above on one side of house. In our opinion this large expanse of glass will be damaging when viewed from the backs of the Albert Street houses, particularly in terms of glare and light pollution at night.

We feel that these proposals are really inappropriate for a listed house in a Conservation Area.
