This application follows a previous one made on 25 June 2014, (Ref: 2014/4299/T). It was rejected in an Objection letter dated 20 August 2014. However, the letter noted that if a further application were submitted to reduce the size of the tree by approximately 25%, then it likely would be approved.

This application is to reduce the size of the maple tree just inside the gate of 4 Hamopstead Grove by 25%.

There are, infact, two trees just inside the gate. One is an ash, quite large, and about 3 feet away from the subject tree at the base. It is the dominate tree. The softer maple has been forced to grow away, and it has become a 'one sided' tree. Its growth has been toward the adjacent block of flats, and the proposed reduction is for that side of the tree, (to the south and southwest). Of note, there are several places where the tree shows evidence of having been trimmed back in a similar manner in past years. The reduction will allow for a more 'vertical' tree and will also allow for more sunlight to reach the adjacing gardens. It also will reduce the considerable amount of dropping leaves and 'whirlagigs', much of which council workers must gather.

I still sincerely believe that it is best to remove the tree as the previous application requested. A small maple across the street will ultimately provide for canopy effect over the street, and the big ash will soo grow into the vacated space which the maple occupied. Further I would be willing to plant another young tree about 5 or 6 feet away which could grow up attractively under the much larger ash. As an aside, the subject maple has already forced me to repair my entrance walkway, (probably of little concern to the council), but ultimately will cause damage to the brick wall separating the property from the public sidewalk. If there is no possibility of removal, then the application is for a simple reduction of 25%. Thank you for your time and consideration.
