Q10 Is roof top view of 9 BPM facing the rear of properties on Daleham Mews, you will note that due to the low height privacy screen this will lead to an increase the sense of enclosure and of overlooking and lead to a greater sense of enclosure as BPM narrows at its cul de sac end to only 3 or so metres to windows of 13, 11, and some extent number 9 Daleham Mews

0.13 Shows the shadow cast by the current roof level onto the rear of number 13 time circa 1-30 pm 19th Feb 2013 any increase in height of 9 BPM will remove light and sunlight from the house and garden.

015 Speaks for itself increased height in BPM obliterates sunlight.

018 Taken from the upper windows of 13 Belsize Crescent shows the maximum sunlight to the rear of the property and the shadow cast by BPM.
