Site Description

The application site is a three storey semi-detached single dwellinghouse on the north side of Wedderburn Road. It is constructed in red brick with a two storey projecting bay and gable at front. At the rear is an inset dormer and a large single storey extension. The site lies within the Fitzjohns/Netherhall Conservation Area and is identified as making a positive contribution to the character and appearance of the conservation area. A large tree is located in front of the property (outside property boundary), but this is not affected by the proposal.

Assessment

1.0 Proposal

- 1.1 Planning permission is sought for the erection of a bin and bicycle storage unit to replace an existing bin store located in the front of the property on the east side (orientated lengthways along the eastern boundary).
- 1.2 The existing bin store is 1.2m wide x 2.7m deep and 1.5m high and located immediately in front of the main house.
- 1.3 The proposed bin store will be 1.3m wide x 3.0m deep x 1.8m high, whilst the bicycle store will be 1.8m wide x 3.3m deep x 1.9m high and located immediately in front of the main house. The stores feature two cycle spaces, an area for recycling and a compartment for waste.
- 1.4 A 1.2m gap between the stores and the property boundary running along the length of the eastern side of the property. The bin store will have painted black wooden doors and the bicycle store will have a black metal roller shutter, the store will be constructed from red brick to match the main property and the materials also match the existing bin store which is to be removed.

Revisions

1.5 The proposal has been revised to exclude large planter boxes on top of the bin stores. Due to their height and bulk, the planters were considered overly large and added too much height to the bin and bicycle store and underline the concerns raised by the Fitzjohns/Netherhall CAAC.

2.0 Assessment

- 2.1 The conservation area statement for Fitzjohns/Netherhall emphasises the importance of front boundaries, particularly the boundary walls and soft landscaping. The statement notes the north side of Wedderburn Road is elevated above street level with views to entrances prominent.
- 2.2 Camden design CPG states adequate space should be provided for waste and recyclables, which should be sensitively designed when in a conservation area. The CPG also advises cycle storage should be constructed with materials sympathetic to the site and surroundings.
- 2.3 The proposed design is considered acceptable, as the materials are sympathetic to the host building and match the existing bin store. The proposal does not result in loss of boundary walls or mature trees, but some minor hedging will be removed. The store is larger (0.4m higher, 0.6m wider and 3.6m deeper) than the existing bin store to accommodate bicycles and three bins, however given it's screened location set behind the surrounding boundary walls and replicated form and materials, the design is considered acceptable and, although larger than the existing, would conserve the character and appearance of the conservation area.
- 2.4 The bin stores, by virtue of their location and increased height would not result in any loss

of light or overshadowing to the neighbours property. The proposal is considered acceptable in terms of amenity.

3.0 Recommendation

3.1 The proposal is considered acceptable on both design and amenity grounds, consistent with the core strategy, design CPG and conservation area statement and therefore it is recommended planning permission be granted.
