I think Anna Vickery may already have informed you of the artwork and memorial application outcome, but I wanted to make sure.

The application was approved by our portfolio holder, so the formal planning application can be submitted.

Comments received during our internal consultation are as follows:

Highways: My only concern would be with regard to its structural stability and the risk that it could fall onto the highway. We have a structures team here who could be able to assess that if necessary

Access officer: The only comments I have on this is that the surface should not be too highly reflective or provide too much glare when the sun is on it as this can create confusion for visually impaired people. There should also be sufficient visual contrast between the paving and the sculpture so that it is clearly visible to all.
