Assessment

The applicant proposes to install a CCTV camera (camera 15) in a prominent position on a sensitive building (number 1 Stone Buildings, adjacent to neighbouring building, above alley). A camera in this position is said to be vital for the security of the site but all conservative options for siting this camera are operationally unsuitable. It is therefore deemed appropriate for this camera to be concealed within a false historic lamp above the doorway, the details of which are controlled by this condition.

The applicant has supplied details of a suitable lamp of historic appearance which will not adversely affect the special interest of the listed building or the character and appearance of the conservation area, but which is reversible and, on reasonably close inspection, will reveal its recent age and function.

The condition is therefore approved.
