The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** advertisement consent for the following reason(s):

Reason(s) for Refusal

The continued display of the scaffold shroud with advertising, by virtue of its excessive size, position on the building, visually prominent location and method of illumination would result in an overtly dominant addition, which is harmful to the character and appearance of the host building, streetscene and the Camden Town Conservation Area. The proposal is therefore contrary to policies CS5 (Managing



the impact of growth and development) and CS14 (Promoting high quality places and conserving our heritage) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy; and policies DP24 (Securing high quality design) and DP25 (Conserving Camden's Heritage) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies.

In dealing with the application, the Council has sought to work with the applicant in a positive and proactive way in accordance with paragraphs 186 and 187 of the National Planning Policy Framework.
