Dear Camden Council,

I am writing from the **Fordwych Residents Association (FRA)** in Fortune Green ward to **object** this planning application for the Brondesbury Eruv.

The reasons for the objection are set out as follows:

1. The FRA objected to a similar proposal several years ago and our position is unchanged.
2. While we strongly support the freedom of religion - we strongly object to one religious group seeking to impose its views across the physical landscape of a large area.
3. We strongly object to the location of poles and wire at the proposed locations in our area - including Minster Road and Mill Lane.
4. We also strongly object to the damage this proposal would do to the public realm across the wider area of West Hampstead and note that this conflicts with widely supported efforts to remove street clutter.
5. We also strongly object to the location of poles and wire in the South Hampstead Conservation Area - as this will cause damage to the character of this area, which is protected by an Article 4 declaration.
6. We also note that not all Jewish people in the area support this proposal - a number of Jewish members of the FRA have indicated to us their objection.

We urge Camden Council planning officers and councillors to reject this application for the clear reasons outlined above.
