[REDACTED] we are most concerned at the proposals contained in the above application to erect a second floor on 7-9 Perrin's Court.

This building is directly to the south-east of our premises; whilst small, we cater for a large regular and passing clientele who are attracted to Perrin's Court and throughout the year enjoy the relatively sheltered external sitting and dining area which benefits from direct sunshine throughout the day an throughout the year.

The proposed extension would rob Perrin's Court of its bright and airy inviting ambience through the reduction of daylight and sunlight; it would turn the Court into a dark alley.

Perrin's Court would lose its attraction and both our own business, as well as the other cafe in the Court and the other traders will lose significantly from passing trade who would no longer feel attracted into this very special thoroughfare. But our restaurant/cafe would suffer the worst, being directly opposite the proposed development; we are seriously concerned at the potential loss of trade should the development go ahead.
