Hi Jenna,

In general lighting should light the face of people, therefore if there is an incident the victim may be able to identify the person. If there is low level then this is unlikely.

Planting should be below 1m and above 2m so there is a view of people.

Lighting:

Communal areas on developments such as roads, footpaths and parking areas should be lit to the standard required by BS 5489: 2013 and the design signed off by a suitably qualified lighting engineer.

The purpose of lighting from a crime prevention perspective is so that people can see the faces of others in order to ascertain whether their intention is hostile or not and to be better able to identify anyone committing crime in that area. The light should be directed down onto the faces rather than sideways/upwards which would contribute to light pollution.

Bollards are deemed unsuitable for communal areas such as car parks and footpaths as they do not achieve this and the light they do provide can be blocked by parked vehicles.

Similarly any light spill from buildings or lighting that can be switched off by residents is not to be considered when calculating the lighting levels.

I have noted that there is bollard lighting which for security we don't accept, as a person's face is unable to be seen. BS 5489 is required. CCTV is unlikely to work effectively with this lighting.
