As a resident of Kentish Town I view the Castle as a historic community building at the gateway to then village. If the building is re-established classified as a Business and dwelling, the historic character will be undermined or completely lost

The presence of historical features, both internal and external, is essential to the building's character. To have them removed and not replaced is entirely to dismiss their value, and to ruin the community value of the building

If the building's listing by Camden as a heritage site is to mean anything its external features must be preserved

Ringley's history of disregard of historic structure on the site they own now is a discouraging indicator of their approach to this building. They are not to be trusted; they have made no attempt to engage with the local community, or to discover their views and concerns. They are the last type of business I would wish to see having responsibility for anything of historic value in our area.
