The Council has considered your application and decided to grant permission subject to the following condition(s):

Condition(s) and Reason(s):

The development hereby permitted must be begun not later than the end of three years from the date of this permission.

Reason: In order to comply with the provisions of Section 91 of the Town and



Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended).

All new external work shall be carried out in materials that resemble, as closely as possible, in colour and texture those of the existing building, unless otherwise specified in the approved application.

Reason: To safeguard the appearance of the premises and the character of the immediate area in accordance with the requirements of policy CS14 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy and policy DP24 and DP25 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies.

The development hereby permitted shall be carried out in accordance with the following approved plans:- Site location plan; 1446pl/01; 1446pl/02; 1446pl/03; Design and Access Statement, Construction Method and Heritage Statement by AW Architecture; technical data for air conditioning units by Daikin; specification for lift by ThyssenKrupp (Ref: PRE-0R04-EN-01); Roof access enclosure specification; Roof access enclosure product sheet by Living daylight (Ref: RL03)

Reason: For the avoidance of doubt and in the interest of proper planning.

Informative(s):

1 Reasons for granting permission.

The proposed roof terrace and associated works are considered to be subordinate in scale and location to the host building and is of an appropriate design by virtue of it mirroring the design and form of the existing roof terraces that have been previously approved along this terrace of buildings. Due to its size and location, it would not significantly harm the amenity of any adjoining residential occupiers in terms of loss of light, outlook, adding to the sense of enclosure or the loss of privacy.

The building has suffered war damage and subsequently was substantially rebuilt behind the façade in the 1960's. As it such the majority of the original historic fabric was lost, and the proposal would therefore not compromise the architectural or historic interest of the building. As the roof terrace and associated enclosure will be located behind the roof apron, it would not be readily visible from the street or from the wider public realm and as such a roof terrace in this location is not considered harmful to the character or appearance of the host building, street scene or the Regents Park Conservation Area.

3 neighbours were consulted, a site notice erected on 17/10/2014, expiring on 07/11/2014, and as site notice published in the local press on 23/10/2014, expiring on 13/11/2014. No objections have been received. The sites planning history was taken into account when coming to this decision.

Considerable importance and weight has been attached to the harm and special

attention has been paid to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of the conservation area, and

the desirability of preserving the listed building or its setting or any features of special architectural or historic interest under s.66 (LB's) and s.72 (CA's) of the Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas Act 1990 as amended by the Enterprise and Regulatory Reform Act (ERR) 2013

As such, the proposed development is in general accordance with policies CS5 and CS14 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy, and policies DP24, DP25 and DP26 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies. The proposed development also accords with policies 7.4, 7.6 and 7.8 of the London Plan 2011; and paragraphs 14, 17, 66 and 126-141 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

- Your proposals may be subject to control under the Building Regulations and/or the London Buildings Acts which cover aspects including fire and emergency escape, access and facilities for people with disabilities and sound insulation between dwellings. You are advised to consult the Council's Building Control Service, Camden Town Hall, Argyle Street WC1H 8EQ, (tel: 020-7974 6941).
- Noise from demolition and construction works is subject to control under the Control of Pollution Act 1974. You must carry out any building works that can be heard at the boundary of the site only between 08.00 and 18.00 hours Monday to Friday and 08.00 to 13.00 on Saturday and not at all on Sundays and Public Holidays. You are advised to consult the Council's Compliance and Enforcement team [Regulatory Services], Camden Town Hall, Argyle Street, WC1H 8EQ (Tel.
