## Network Rail Consultation Response - 2014/6593/P

Dear Seonaid,

Thank you very much for consulting with Network Rail in regards to planning application 2014/6593/P.

I am writing to express Network Rail's support for the proposed application by Theatre Tracks Limited for a temporary theatre venue to be known as The King's Cross Theatre, to be located at Zone A, Goods Way, King's Cross Central, London N1C 4UR to run from December 2014 until January 2016.

This is a time limited temporary venue, in place for performances for 14 months, with three weeks for build and two weeks for take down.

Network Rail are proud to be associated with this production not only because it features a live steam locomotive but also due to the affiliation with The Railway Children Charity, a charity that was launched in 1995 to help stop the abuse of children living alone and at risk on the streets, through early intervention.

Network Rail believe that the production will be hugely beneficial to the local area and will greatly add to the type of offering available to visitors that come to the Kings Cross area.

Network Rail is working closely with the production teams at Theatre Tracks to maximise the success of the show whilst minimising the impact on the Station and local area itself.

The applicant should continue to liaise with Network Rail's Asset Protection LNE team as the scheme progress. This will help to ensure that the safety and operation of the railway is maintained.
