There is at present, a basement excavation at No 63 Goldhurst (only 2 doors away) and the work is causing considerable disruption in the street. Heavy duty construction regularly takes place on the pavement forcing pedestrians onto the road. This site consistently occupies 3 parking bays by blocking them with RSJ's.</p> <p>This makes resident parking extremely difficult and the noise, dirt etc lowers the tone of the street. If you allow yet another major building project this already intolerable situation will be compounded. This construction company "Dig for Victory" regularly flouts the parking regulations yet seems to get away with it all the time. It was the same when the undertook another basement excavation across the street. That coupled with all the other work which the council agree to is making parking almost impossible. The road is littered with yellow parking restriction notices some which appear overnight and penalise residents who may have parked a few days previous. Yet the builders seem to be able to block the road at will. As a council you should consider all aspects of disruption and the planning and parking divisions should liaise before allowing large lengthy works which never seem to finish on time. Only a certain number should be authorised at a time. This is a residential road which is rapidly turning into a giant construction site.</p>
