Response

The amount of trees to be removed has been kept to a minimum given the sensitive nature of the site. To achieve a risk free scenario all trees within a tree's height of the structures would need to be removed, a situation which is unacceptable to the client and stakeholders. A degree of risk needs to be adopted so that the benefits that the retained trees offer can be appreciated.

Essentially, the design philosophy is to remove trees where they are within the part of a spillway which is on the dam itself. If a tree is part of a spillway which is in natural ground sufficiently clear of the dam, it can be retained by reinforcing the turf around the tree. The many trees which are still on the dams will have to be managed and inspected to ensure that they are in good condition and therefore less likely to be pushed over by winds.

The heath tree team undertake periodic tree risk management surveys of the trees on the heath as part of dispensing their duty of care to surrounding people or property, during the course of these surveys any defective trees close to the dams or on the spillways will have to be identified and works undertaken to reduce the risk of harm and subsequent potential for damage to the structures.
