To have a similar bunker-like, ugly, solid building right next to it will further spoil our view and infringe on our privacy. Also, it will further destroy the appearance of our neighbourhood, which is supposed to be a conservation area!</p> <p>Over the last few years, the building works at no 38 caused a lot of disturbance to us, the noise and dust and radios at times being intolerable. For lengthy periods, it was impossible to use our garden, or indeed to open the garden doors at all, and I was woken up early each morning by heavy drilling. At my age – I am now 87 – this was highly disruptive and bad for my condition. As a musician, I am highly sensitive to noise. So is my partner, Dorinde van Oort, who is a writer and works at home. The situation will be even more aggravating if the planned new building will go ahead, as it is even closer to our house.</p> <p>The site is too small to store the heavy machinery and materials needed, which will mean lengthy obstruction due to sheds on the pavements of Redington Road.</p> <p>I already experienced difficulty in having my house insured because the foundations were deemed inadequate. Another basement and sub-basement so near to the existing ones will inevitably cause even more severe problems with the water table and the stability of the foundations.</p> <p>We therefore strongly object to the proposed planning application.</p> |

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
