Prune London Plane (602) (ID# 1) located at the Opp 2 Raymond Building according to the following specifications:

- Clean to remove all dead, diseased and broken branches 3 centimetres in diameter and larger throughout crown to improve health and appearance and reduce risk of branch failure.
- Remove lower branches to a height of 5-5.5 metres to improve clearance over road.
- Thin crown to remove approximately 20% of live branches to improve light and air penetration through crown. Most thinning cuts will be between 2 and 3 centimetres in diameter.

Prune London Plane (606) (ID# 2) located at the Opp 4 Raymond Buildings according to the following specifications:

- Clean to remove all dead, diseased and broken branches 2 centimetres in diameter and larger throughout crown to improve health and appearance and reduce risk of branch failure.
- Thin crown to remove approximately 20% of live branches to provide branch definition.

Most thinning cuts will be between 2 and 3 centimetres in diameter.

Prune London Plane (611) (ID# 3) located at the Head of Ped Wlk according to the following specifications:

- Reduce lateral on west side of main stem by approximately 2-2.5 metres to reduce risk of branch failure

Prune Silver Maple (614) (ID# 4) located at the Lawn Stone Chambers according to the following specifications:

- Clean to remove all dead, diseased and broken branches 2 centimetres in diameter and larger throughout crown to improve health and appearance and reduce risk of branch failure.
- Reduce crown height and spread by approximately 2-2.5 metres to reduce risk of branch or stem failure.

Prune Red Maple (616) (ID# 5) located at the R/O Atkin Buildings according to the following specifications:

- Clean to remove all dead, diseased and broken branches 2 centimetres in diameter and larger throughout crown to improve health and appearance and reduce risk of branch failure.
- Reduce west side of crown by approximately 1-1.5 metres to enhance natural form.

Prune London Plane (619) (ID# 6) located at the On Bank R/O Raymond Building according to the following specifications:

- Clean to remove all dead, diseased and broken branches 2 centimetres in diameter and larger throughout crown to improve health and appearance and reduce risk of branch failure.
- Reduce west side of main stem by approximately 3-3.5 metres to reduce risk of branch or stem failure.

Prune Hornbeam (622) (ID# 7) located at the (End of Raymond) according to the following specifications:

- Clean to remove all dead, diseased and broken branches 2 centimetres in diameter and larger throughout crown to improve health and appearance and reduce risk of branch failure.

Prune False Acacia (625) (ID# 8) located at the North of Raymond Building according to the following specifications:

- Clean to remove all dead, diseased and broken branches 2 centimetres in diameter and larger throughout crown to improve health and appearance and reduce risk of branch failure.

Prune London Plane (629) (ID# 9) located at the Upper Bank according to the following specifications:

- Clean to remove all dead, diseased and broken branches 2 centimetres in diameter and larger throughout crown to improve health and appearance and reduce risk of branch failure.
- Reduce crown height and spread by approximately 4-4.4 metres to reduce risk of branch, stem and/or root failure.

Prune London Plane (641) (ID# 10) located at the Gravel area/seat according to the following specifications:

- Clean to remove all dead, diseased and broken branches 2 centimetres in diameter and larger throughout crown to improve health and appearance and reduce risk of branch failure.
- Reduce crown height and spread by approximately 2-2.5 metres to reduce risk of branch, stem and/or root failure.

Prune London Plane (642) (ID# 11) located at the West lawn according to the following specifications:

- Clean to remove all dead, diseased and broken branches 2 centimetres in diameter and larger throughout crown to improve health and appearance and reduce risk of branch failure.
- Reduce western co-dominant stem and spread by approximately 6-6.4 metres to reduce risk of branch or stem failure.

Prune Red Oak (649) (ID# 12) located at the Main Avenue according to the following specifications:

- Clean to remove all dead, diseased and broken branches 2 centimetres in diameter and larger throughout crown to improve health and appearance and reduce risk of branch failure.

Prune Red Oak (650) (ID# 13) located at the Main Ave according to the following specifications:

- Clean to remove all dead, diseased and broken branches 3 centimetres in diameter and larger throughout crown to improve health and appearance and reduce risk of branch failure.
- Reduce western section of crown by approximately 2-2.5 metres to enhance natural form.

Prune Red Oak (661) (ID# 14) located at the Main Ave according to the following specifications:

- Clean to remove all dead, diseased and broken branches 2 centimetres in diameter and larger throughout crown to improve health and appearance and reduce risk of branch failure.

Prune Red Oak (663) (ID# 15) located at the Main Ave according to the following specifications:

- Clean to remove all dead, diseased and broken branches 2 centimetres in diameter and larger throughout crown to improve health and appearance and reduce risk of branch failure.

Prune London Plane (677) (ID# 16) located at the Adj main gate according to the following specifications:

- Clean to remove all dead, diseased and broken branches 2 centimetres in diameter and larger throughout crown to improve health and appearance and reduce risk of branch failure.

Remove all visible stem girdling roots from the London Plane (677) (ID# 16) located at the Adj main gate to prevent further damage to the plant.

Prune Crabapple (916) (ID# 17) located at the Lawn Area according to the following specifications:
