## 2014/5447/P - 13 Egbert Street NW1 8LJ - Section 73 Application

Ms. Glaister and Mr. Craddock, the owners of 13 Egbert Street, wish to make a minor material amendment to the Planning Permission granted for works to their property.

The amendment is to a lower ground back window facing their enclosed rear garden. The existing window is a non-original timber sash window. The planning permission covered widening the window opening to allow the installation of a glass door. The proposed amendment is to retain the width of the existing opening but lower the cill for the installation of a frameless glass oriel window, projecting 350mm. The oriel window would provide a window seat to enjoy the private garden.

We also propose to pitch the conservatory glass roof back towards the house, which allows more refined and delicate detailing of the conservatory, avoiding a gutter over the garden door. Overall the proposed roof will be lower than the original approved planning application.
