					The building is a good and sadly diminishing example of a substantial, elegant well-proportioned Victorian pub, with fine fenestration, adjacent to an exceptionally preserved conservation area and is listed as a non-designated heritage asset.
					As a non-designated heritage asset it contributes to the immediate area"s "sense of place, local distinctiveness and civic pride" (from wearecamden.org). These features help make it a special for local people; Annie"s Pub carries "history, traditions, stories and memories into the present day" (from wearecamden.org). It contributes to Camden"s distinctive identity. To quote a local resident: "As a public house Annie"s provided an accessible affordable place to meet friends, watch the football and be served reasonably priced food. For some elderly BARA residents it was the only feasible pub within walking distance [] Additionally the downstairs room hosted popular comedy nights giving local talent an opportunity to try "stand up", and there were various other themed evening events such as Rockabilly night which brought variety and flavour to the local scene".
					Situated on the corner of Kentish Town Road and Patshull Road it is a well-known local landmark, with significant traditional, historical and social functions as well as aesthetic integrity. Appropriate lighting and signage for the townscape of a Victorian street, close to a conservation area, is a valued aspect of this site. A switch to commercial high-street type lighting for after hours would be completely inappropriate to the site.
					As a public house, it provides a valuable community asset to local people from a diverse social group reflecting the historic demographic of the area which I'm keen to see preserved, especially those people living to the east of Kentish Town where there are fewer public houses.
					The ideal use for this building would be to continue serving the community either as a pub or as a café or bar. Any change of use would be detrimental in terms of loss of amenity or service to the local community.
					NB on 12/01/15, on behalf of BARA (Bartholomew Area Residents" Association), I nominated Annie"s Pub as an "asset of community value".
