This makes it impossible to assess the planning application fully as it is unclear where children will be travelling from. It is thoroughly disappointing that the Council have only just started a consultation on this issue, when it should have been decided far earlier.</p> <p>Given these problems I object to the plans in their current form.</p>

The industrial estate on Liddell Road has had long established family run local businesses on it for many years and is one of the few industrial estates left in the local area for people in these trades. The road itself has never been maintained by Camden and therefore has been left to look atrocious. The plans for a school expansion are also now completely unnecessary after recent changes on Kilburn University.</p> <p>Just refurbish the site as it is and let these businesses have a home in the local area. 2014/7649/P	Anna Voelker	12 Hall Oak Walk	16/01/2015 20:11:19	OBJ	<p>Main objections:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Catchment area</li><li>- Two sites separated by age</li></ul> <p>Catchment area:</p> <p>The current catchment area of Kingsgate School does not include the local children in the Sidings Estate, Maygrove Road, or indeed the proposed new flats on the development site. This means that the local children cannot go to the local school right opposite where they live. This school will not benefit the community that will be heavily impacted by the development. Two separate catchment areas might be a solution.</p> <p>Two sites separated by age:</p> <p>In the current proposal, small children will have to travel between the two sites along very busy and polluted streets. Also parents with children in both sites face difficult logistics. Walking time for an adult is estimated to be 15minutes. This is an unrealistic time when walking with a small child along crowded pavements.</p> <p>If the Liddell Road school was organised as a Kingsgate B, with a full primary school for 3-11 year olds this would save the long walk between the buildings along busy streets. It would also make it possible to have two separate catchment areas.</p> <p>Any school built there needs to support working families by offering pre-and post-school clubs from 8am to 6pm.</p>

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
