archaeological advice to boroughs in accordance with the National Planning Policy
Framework and GLAAS Charter.

The proposed development site does not lie within an archaeological priority area
and on the basis of existing records and recent land use seems unlikely to have
significant potential for surviving pre-19th century remains. However the applicant's
proposed desk-based assessment should review this and also assess whether the
19th century reservoir itself has any heritage interest.
