A Parapet says people will be out on the roof area, so we object to any additional intrusion to our privacy. We are affected by the workmen and they are temporary, so we know we will be even more affected when the houses are occupied. We have an uninterrupted view of the bathroom and toilet; needless to say ditto! Any one living in those houses will be able to see into the top floor bedroom and second floor bathroom – in summer we will no longer have the luxury of either leaving the curtains open or opening the windows to these two room. Our way of life will be transformed; we will no longer be comfortable in our once happy and carefree accommodation.
