T1 Lime x 1

Large, mature, previously reduced tree. To maintain this tree and to reduce the mechanical loading, the suggested works are: To reduce back to the previous points of reduction, retain shortened furnishing growth for crown continuity, remove trunk and basal growth, remove deadwood.

Front right

T2 Purple leaf Plum x 1

Mature, previously reduced tree. This tree has a large, compression fork main union. These unions can be prone to failure through mechanical loading. To reduce the mechanical loading, the suggested works are: To reduce back to the previous points of reduction, clean out crown, remove deadwood.

Rear left

T3 Lime x 1

Large, mature, previously reduced tree. To maintain this tree and to maximise the light, the suggested works are: To reduce back to the previous points of reduction, retain shortened furnishing growth for crown continuity, remove trunk and basal growth, remove deadwood.

Rear left

T4 Lime x 1

Large, mature, pollarded tree. This tree has been pollarded due to the dominant stem being lost in the '87 storm. This has left a wound which is decaying with large, heavy pieces of re-growth sat on it. To reduce the mechanical loading on the tree, the suggested works are: To re-pollard to the previous pollard points.

Rear, left corner

T5 Horse Chestnut x 1

Medium sized, early mature tree. This tree leans out over the neighbouring property. To reduce this encroachment, the suggested works are: To reduce the height and lateral spread all round by 2m, remove deadwood.

Rear boundary

T6 Norway Maple x 1

Large, mature tree. This tree is outgrowing its location and is encroaching on the neighbouring property. There is also a large root sucker that leans out into the neighbours garden. The suggested works are: To fell the root sucker to ground level, reduce the height and lateral spread all round by 2-2.5m, remove deadwood.

Rear right

T7 Unknown x 1

Large, ivy, smothered, pollarded tree. Because of the ivy it is very difficult to work out what this tree is and if it is safe. The suggested works are: To remove the ivy from the tree down to fence height and re-pollard to previous points.
