Proposal: Detail of bird boxes required by condition 1 of planning permission 2014/1433/P, dated 13/06/2014, for submission of reserved matters relating to development zone K (Grade II Listed Midland Goods Shed and Handyside Canopies) for alterations and refurbishment works to provide a total of 3,385sqm of retail floorspace (Class A1) and 3,838sqm of educational uses (Class D1) inclusive of a cookery school with associated public realm works, plant, refuse and cycle storage, and staff facilities.

The Council has considered your application and decided to grant permission.

Informative(s):

The proposal details that 24x house sparrow terraces (3 pairs per box) or boxes are fitted in a row in the West Handyside Canopy. 4x Starling boxes are also proposed will be installed within the Canopy. Specifications of the proposed boxes



have been provided. Such features will conserve and enhance wildlife habitats and biodiversity measures within the development. The details submitted are therefore sufficient to discharge condition 1 of planning permission 2014/1433/P.

As such, the proposed details are in general accordance with policy CS15 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy, policy 7.19 of the London Plan 2011; and paragraphs 7, 109, and 118 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

2 You are advised that condition 2 relating to planning permission 2014/1433/P granted 13/06/2014 is still outstanding and needs to be discharged.

In dealing with the application, the Council has sought to work with the applicant in a positive and proactive way in accordance with paragraphs 186 and 187 of the National Planning Policy Framework.
