Dear Mr Oxford,

As tenants of Origin Housing, and residents of 104-110 Haverstock Hill, we object to the felling of a tree in the back gardens. The application states that the tree is a pyrus and is situated in the garden to the rear of 104 Haverstock Hill. There are no pear trees still surviving in that garden. However there are three pear trees in the garden to the rear of 106 HH.

There is a dead pear tree at the back of the gardens on the border between the 104 and 106 gardens, and the application could refer to this tree. However in a response to the application it is stated that the tree which is the subject of the application is in the garden of 106 HH and is situated just to the rear of the house.

This is a much cherished tree covered in the spring by the pear blossoms. A little later the large blooms, in their hundreds, if not thousands, of the clematis appear. Following on the tresses of the wisteria make their appearance. Then it is the hundreds of scented blooms of the climbing roses that in the spring and summer cover the branches of the pear.

The tree is alive and despite it's age continues to flourish and give joy to residents and visitors.

We do not want this tree to be felled.
