It faces directly into our bedroom and toilet windows. When 20 Albert Terrace Mews was originally built, permission was granted for the current, smaller windows presumably for this very reason to protect the privacy of the house opposite. So why would the council now allow a new window to be installed, nearly five times as large? The planning application as submitted states 'Obscure glazing'. We assume this means a minimum of Level 5 obscurity, but it does not say this specifically on the submitted application as far as we can see. Our strong preference is for the original window design to be kept, as it was done for a good reason at the time, which remains totally valid today.
