The application seeks to discharge condition 4 of planning application 2013/4935/P. The detailed design and materials of the proposed window to the two storey rear extension is considered to be of a high quality. The proposed sash window would be in keeping with the characteristic of the Conservation Area. The submission in regards to design is in line with policies DP24 and DP25 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies.
