1 Reasons for granting permission.

The material proposed is considered to be high quality and appropriate for the conservation area. The timber cladding would weather down to an appropriate tone and be complimentary to the existing brickwork of the host building. The proposal is therefore considered to preserve and enhance the character and appearance of the Conservation Area.

Special attention has been paid to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of the conservation area, under s.72 of the Listed



Buildings and Conservation Areas Act 1990 as amended by the Enterprise and Regulatory Reform Act (ERR) 2013.

As such, the proposed development is in general accordance with policy CS14 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy, and policies DP24 and DP25 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies.
