The Council has considered your application and decided to grant permission.

Informative(s):

1 The submitted Construction Method Statement (2015) confirms that employees to the site would arrive by public transport and will not require vehicle parking; loading and unloading of vehicles would be done at the junction of Tudor Close; materials would be taken directly inside of the site; skips would be used where necessary; and that in relation waste, waste companies would be used for collection and that where possible materials would be separate to allow for their proper disposal and recycling.



The above details have been considered by the Highways Officer to adequately address the requirements of condition 3. Therefore the condition may be discharged as it complies with policy CS11 (Sustainable and efficient travel) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy, and policies DP16(Development and transport implications), DP20(Movement of goods and materials) and DP26(Managing the impact of development on occupiers and neighbours) the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Framework
