## DECISION

Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended)

## Councils Own Permission Under Regulation 3 Granted Subject to a Section 106 Legal Agreement

Address: End Corner Plots at Grafton Road Lamble Street Barrington Court London NW5

Proposal:

Erection of 3 no. new-build dwellings (1x3 bed, 1x 2bed and 1x1bed) and associated external work at end of existing terraces on Grafton Road, Lamble Street and Barrington Court.

The Council has considered your application and decided to grant permission subject to the following condition(s):



Ms Amy Waite Hayhurst and Co 26 Fournier Street London E1 6QE Condition(s) and Reason(s):

1 The development hereby permitted must be begun not later than the end of three years from the date of this permission.

Reason: In order to comply with the provisions of Section 91 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended).

2 Detailed drawings in respect of the following, shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the local planning authority before the relevant part of the work is begun:

a) Details including sections at 1:10 of all windows (including jambs, head and cill), doors and balconies;

The relevant part of the works shall be carried out in accordance with the details thus approved and all approved samples shall be retained on site during the course of the works.

Reason: To safeguard the appearance of the premises and the character of the immediate area in accordance with the requirements of policy CS14 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy and policy DP24 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies.

3 The development hereby permitted shall be carried out in accordance with the following approved plans:

Site location plan; 145/A001Rev1; 002Rev1; 003Rev1; 004; 005 145/A200Rev1; 201Rev1; 202Rev1; 203; 204; 205; 206; 207; 208; 210Rev 1; 211; 212; 213; 214; 215; 145/A100 Rev 2; 101; 102; 103; 104; 105; 106 & 107; Design and Access Statement by Hayhurst & Co dated April 2014; Arboricultural Report by Simon Pryce dated 15/2/2014; Code for Sustainable Homes pre-assessment dated Nov 2013; Ecological Assessment by Middlemarch Environmental dated March 2014 & Lifetime Homes by Hayhurst & Co.

## Reason:

For the avoidance of doubt and in the interest of proper planning.

4 All work shall be carried out in accordance with the relevant recommendations of British Standard 3998: 2010. (Recommendation for Tree Work)

Reason: To ensure the preservation of the amenity value and health of the trees.

5 Full details in respect of the green roosf in the areas indicated on the approved plans shall be submitted to and approved by the local planning authority before the relevant part of the development commences. The buildings shall not be occupied until the approved details have been implemented and these works shall be permanently retained and maintained thereafter.

Reason: In order to ensure the development undertakes reasonable measures to

take account of biodiversity and the water environment in accordance with policies CS13, CS15 and CS16 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy and policies DP22, DP23 and DP32 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies.

6 Prior to the commencement of any works on site, a method statement demonstrating how the Copper Beech tree on Site C shall be protected during construction work shall be submitted to and approved by the Council in writing. Such details shall follow guidelines and standards set out in BS5837:2012 "Trees in Relation to Construction". All trees on the site, or parts of trees growing from adjoining sites, unless shown on the permitted drawings as being removed, shall be retained and protected from damage in accordance with the approved protection details.

Reason: To ensure that the development will not have an adverse effect on existing trees and in order to maintain the character and amenity of the area in accordance with the requirements of policy CS15 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy.

7 The covered cycle storage areas as indicated on the approved plans shall be provided in its entirety prior to the first occupation of any of the new units, and permanently retained thereafter.

Reason: To ensure the development provides adequate cycle parking facilities in accordance with the requirements of policy CS11of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy and policy DP17of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies.

8 Noise levels at a point 1 metre external to sensitive facades shall be at least 5dB(A) less than the existing background measurement (LA90), expressed in dB(A) when all plant/equipment (or any part of it) is in operation unless the plant/equipment hereby permitted will have a noise that has a distinguishable, discrete continuous note (whine, hiss, screech, hum) and/or if there are distinct impulses (bangs, clicks, clatters, thumps), then the noise levels from that piece of plant/equipment at any sensitive façade shall be at least 10dB(A) below the LA90, expressed in dB(A).

Reason: To safeguard the amenities of the [adjoining] premises [and the area generally] in accordance with the requirements of policy CS5 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy and policies DP26 and DP28 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies.

9 \*Prior to first occupation of any of the residential units, the landowner shall ensure through agreement that occupiers of the new units are informed of the Council's policy that they shall not be entitled (unless they are the holder of a disabled person's badge issued pursuant to s. 21 of the Chronically Sick and Disabled Persons Act 1970) to be granted a Residents Parking Permit to park a vehicle in a residents parking bay; shall not be able to buy a contract permanently to park within any car park owned, controlled or licensed by the Council nor shall they be entitled to be granted a Business Parking Permit.

Reason: In order to ensure that the development does not contribute to increased car use and parking congestion in accordance with the requirements of policies CS11 (Promoting sustainable and efficient travel) and CS19 (Delivering and monitoring the Core Strategy) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy and policies DP18 (Parking standards and the availability of car parking) and DP19 (Managing the impact of parking) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies.

10 \* Code for Sustainable Homes

Prior to implementation of each phase of the development, the applicant and/or developer shall submit to the local planning authority a design stage Sustainability Assessment setting out the manner in which the development will achieve Code for Sustainable Homes (CfSH) level 4 for the residential units.

The development shall be implemented in accordance with the Assessment as approved.

Prior to first occupation of each phase of the residential units, a post-completion certificate which demonstrates that the phase has achieved Level 4 shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the local planning authority.

Reason: In order to secure the appropriate energy and resource efficiency measures in accordance with the requirements of policies CS13 (Tackling climate change through promoting higher environmental standards), CS16 (Improving Camden's health and well-being) and CS19 (Delivering and monitoring the Core Strategy) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy and policies DP22 (Promoting sustainable design and construction) and DP23 (Water) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies.

11 \*Prior to implementation of the development, confirmation that the necessary measures to secure the necessary highway works for the development shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority.

Reason: To ensure the development has an acceptable impact on the adjacent highway and provides an attractive safe and secure environment in accordance with the requirements of policies CS5 (Managing the impact of growth and development), CS11 (Promoting sustainable and efficient travel), CS17 (Making Camden a safer place) and CS19 (Delivering and monitoring the Core Strategy) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy and policies DP16 (The transport implications of development), DP17 (Walking, cycling and public transport), DP20 (Movement of goods and materials) and DP21 (Development connecting to the highway network) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Policies.

## 12 \* Tree replacement and food growing

Prior to implementation of the development, confirmation that the necessary measures to secure provision of a food growing area and appropriate replacements for the 6 Cherry trees, on the wider estate, shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. The approved growing area shall thereafter be provided in its entirety prior to the first occupation of any of the new units, and permanently retained thereafter.

Any trees or areas of planting which, within a period of 5 years from the completion of the development, die, are removed or become seriously damaged or diseased, shall be replaced as soon as is reasonably possible and, in any case, by not later than the end of the following planting season, with others of similar size and species, unless the Council gives written consent to any variation.

Reason: In order to ensure the development undertakes reasonable measures to take account of biodiversity and environmental initiatives in accordance with policies CS15 and CS16 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy and policies DP22 and DP32 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies.

13 \* CMP

Prior to implementation, including demolition, a Construction Management Plan (CMP) including an Air Quality Assessment) shall be submitted to and approved by the local planning authority.

The CMP shall set out all measures that the Owner will adopt in undertaking the demolition of the existing buildings and the construction of the Development using good site practices in accordance with the Council's Considerate Contractor Manual.

Such plan shall include measures to for ensuring highway safety and managing transport, deliveries and waste (including recycling of materials) throughout the demolition and construction periods and which demonstrates consideration of and liaison with other local concurrent developments. The CMP shall also include details of a community working group involving local residents and businesses, a contractor complaints/call-line and measures to be carried out to mitigate the impact of the noise arising from construction and demolition activities on local residents and businesses, a waste management strategy and means of monitoring and reviewing the CMP from time to time.

The measures contained in the Construction Management Plan shall at all times remain implemented during all works of construction and demolition. Where separate Construction Management Plans are submitted for the demolition and the construction phases the provisions of this condition will apply to both plans.

Reason: In order to protect the pedestrian environment and the amenities of the area generally and to ensure the continued free flow of traffic in the area in accordance with Policies CS5 and CS11 of the London Borough of Camden Local

Development Framework Core Strategy and policies DP16, DP17 and DP26 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies.

14 \*No development shall commence until such time as the Council has confirmed in writing that it has received plans demonstrating the levels at the interface of the development with the boundary of the Property and the Public Highway.

Reason: To ensure that the scheme promotes the use of sustainable transport means in accordance with policy CS11 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy.

15 In the event that any owners of the land have the legal locus to enter into a Section 106 Agreement no works shall be progress on site until such time as they have entered into such an Agreement incorporating obligations in respect of the matters covered by conditions marked with \* in this notice of planning permission.

Reason: In order to define the permission and to secure development in accordance with policy CS19 (Delivering and monitoring the Core Strategy) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy.

Informative(s):

- 1 Your proposals may be subject to control under the Building Regulations and/or the London Buildings Acts which cover aspects including fire and emergency escape, access and facilities for people with disabilities and sound insulation between dwellings. You are advised to consult the Council's Building Control Service, Camden Town Hall, Argyle Street WC1H 8EQ, (tel: 020-7974 6941).
- 2 The Mayor of London introduced a Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) to help pay for Crossrail on 1st April 2012. Any permission granted after this time which adds more than 100sqm of new floorspace or a new dwelling will need to pay this CIL. It will be collected by Camden on behalf of the Mayor of London. Camden will be sending out liability notices setting out how much CIL will need to be paid if an affected planning application is implemented and who will be liable.

The proposed charge in Camden will be £50 per sqm on all uses except affordable housing, education, healthcare, and development by charities for their charitable purposes. You will be expected to advise us when planning permissions are implemented. Please use the forms at the link below to advise who will be paying the CIL and when the development is to commence. You can also access forms to allow you to provide us with more information which can be taken into account in your CIL calculation and to apply for relief from CIL.

We will then issue a CIL demand notice setting out what monies needs to paid when and how to pay. Failure to notify Camden of the commencement of development will result in a surcharge of £2500 or 20% being added to the CIL

payment. Other surcharges may also apply for failure to assume liability and late payment. Payments will also be subject to indexation in line with the construction costs index.

- 3 Your proposals may be subject to control under the Party Wall etc Act 1996 which covers party wall matters, boundary walls and excavations near neighbouring buildings. You are advised to consult a suitably qualified and experienced Building Engineer.
- 4 The matters covered by conditions marked with an \* are matters which would usually be incorporated into a Section 106 Agreement. On Council own schemes because the Council cannot enter into an agreement with itself the usual practice would for the permission to reference the Section 106 requirements for information.

If the Council retains ownership of the application site although the reference to Section 106 requirements would not be legally binding they would act as a record of the requirements the Council as planning authority expects the Council as landowner to comply with. If the Council disposes of a relevant interest in the Application Site (which for the avoidance of doubt will not include disposals to individual tenants and occupiers) the incoming owner will be required to enter into a Section 106 giving effect to those requirements which will then become a legally binding document.

- 5 Noise from demolition and construction works is subject to control under the Control of Pollution Act 1974. You must carry out any building works that can be heard at the boundary of the site only between 08.00 and 18.00 hours Monday to Friday and 08.00 to 13.00 on Saturday and not at all on Sundays and Public Holidays. You are advised to consult the Council's Compliance and Enforcement team [Regulatory Services], Camden Town Hall, Argyle Street, WC1H 8EQ (Tel. 020 7974 4444 the website No. or on http://www.camden.gov.uk/ccm/content/contacts/councilcontacts/environment/contact-the-environmental-health-team.en or seek prior approval under Section 61 of the Act if you anticipate any difficulty in carrying out construction other than within the hours stated above.
- 6 If a revision to the postal address becomes necessary as a result of this development, application under Part 2 of the London Building Acts (Amendment) Act 1939 should be made to the Camden Contact Centre on Tel: 020 7974 4444 or Environment Department (Street Naming & Numbering) Camden Town Hall, Argyle Street, WC1H 8EQ.
- 7 This consent is without prejudice to, and shall not be construed as derogating from, any of the rights, powers, and duties of the Council pursuant to any of its statutory functions or in any other capacity and, in particular, shall not restrict the Council from exercising any of its powers or duties under the Highways Act 1980 (as amended). In particular your attention is drawn to the need to obtain permission for any part of the structure which overhangs the public highway (including footway). Permission should be sought from the Council's Engineering Service Network

Management Team, Town Hall, Argyle Street WC1H 8EQ, (tel: 020 7974 2410) or email highwayengineering@camden.gov.uk.

In dealing with the application, the Council has sought to work with the applicant in a positive and proactive way in accordance with paragraphs 186 and 187 of the National Planning Policy Framework.
