I am writing to oppose the above planning application, especially, on the grounds of:
~ design and layout
~ external appearance and materials
~ noise nuisance

Goodge Street does not have one single terrance at the front of the house; this is unacceptable from a town scape point of view. This is a conservation area with no other such development here. I believe that the building concerned and all the houses in Goodge Street are listed as positive contributors to the area; this planning application does not fit with this.

The issue of amenity: the increase of noise and nuisance in one of the most densely residential areas in the West End with bedrooms normally at the front of the houses and children also being brought up here is unacceptable.

In this area we have now had decades of unwanted noise and 'development'. This planning application makes no positive contribution in any way to the area and bring no benefits whatsoever. As an immediate neighbour this would be another blight on the quality of my life in the area. I am sure that you are aware that WHO list unwanted noise as a killer. I am 99.9% sure that the continuous stress caused by unwanted non-stop development all around my home is a direct contributor to dangerous levels of stress and long-term health conditions. In addition, yet again, this continuous erosion of my environment in so many ways may be in breach of my basic human rights, in particular, the right to the peaceful enjoyment of my property.

I urge you and the council to reject the application in full.
