## Reason(s) for Refusal

The conversion of self-contained accommodation to non-self-contained accommodation at ground floor level would result in the loss of a self-contained flat contrary to policy CS6 (Providing Quality Homes) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy and policy DP9 (Student housing, bedsits and other housing with shared facilities) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies.
