I would like to object in the strongest terms to this Application.

One reason for this objection is the inevitable damage caused by heavy traffic to and from the site over a period of many months. There is no possibility that the lane could be restored to its former attractive calm, after such an onslaught. This uniquely undeveloped edge of the Heath would be lost forever were this scheme to be allowed.

Crucially, the obvious hazards of mixing heavy construction traffic with the walkers, runners, swimmers, cyclists and children who currently use the lane, cannot be too highly stressed. The air quality would deteriorate and there would inevitably be accidents.

I note that the application is including a basement. The trial pits and boreholes that will be required to investigate and prepare for this would act as a conduit for water. Fissuring the clay would also transmit ground water. Such work is likely to impact on the fragile structure of the ground here. The adverse impact of building on the ground water regime and therefore on the water quality oif the ponds is of central concern, but so too is the lack of assurances that fuel and building materials would be securely stored with no possibility of leakage, Such leakages would obviously threaten, not just the water quality of the ponds, but also the wild life of the neighbourhood.

The signatories of this letter are frequent users of the Heath, as swimmers, cyclists,walkers, and joggers. We do most anxiously ask Camden Council officers to reject this Application with all its deleterious consequences.
