I very much doubt that the "green" wall would be viable, owing to the lack of light in the area. Trees planted there in the past failed to grow, as they received no direct sunlight. We do not know what type of vegetation is envisaged in this plan: it would have to be evergreen, or the wall would be bare during winter, and would consequently act as a sounding board for any noise, thus exacerbating, rather than alleviating, the noise problem.</p> <p>I am also concerned about the noise that the lift would cause, especially at night.</p> <p>The new loggia entrance would provide only single-file access to the building: how would people manage to evacuate The Generator in the instance of fire? This is of particular importance when you bear in mind that the building now accommodates nearly four times as many people as it was originally built for. Have the fire regulations been complied with?</p> <p>If this planning application is granted, Would The Generator be able to use the proposed wall as a precedent for further extending the building?</p> |

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
